<u>Bill</u> Bogart

W.A. Bogart, B.A., LL.B. (University of Toronto), LL.M. (Harvard) is a University Professor and Professor of Law at the University of Windsor (retired). He has held several SSHRC and other research grants to support his research. Professor Bogart has also been a Virtual Scholar in Residence for the Law Commission of Canada and a frequent consultant to government.

Professor Bogart is the Author/editor of eight books, with the last three books on regulation of consumption. The books are *Permit But Discourage: Regulating Excessive Consumption* (OUP/NY, 2011), *Regulating Obesity?: Government, Society and Questions of Health* (OUP/NY, 2013), and *Off the Street: Legalizing Drugs* (Dundurn, 2016). He blogs for the Huffington Post and comments frequently for the media.

He is a member of the Research Ethics Board of St. Michael's Hospital Toronto, the Advisory Board of the National Self-Represented Litigants Project, and the Panel on Research Ethics (CIHR, SSHRC, NSERC). Together with his wife, Linda Bertoldi, Professor Bogart is a patron the Alzheimer Society of Toronto. He is a past member of the boards for Pro Bono Law Ontario and Canadian Law and Society. Professor Bogart is currently working on his next book, *Worth Fighting For?: Canada in a Turbulent World*.

Professor Irish publishes regularly on trade and development, WTO law, climate change, regionalism, NAFTA, and Canadian customs tariff law. Dr. Irish has served on dispute settlement panels under the Canada-United States Free Trade Agreement and the North American Free Trade Agreement.
