What is privacy?

- A nebulous philosophical, legal, social and technological concept
- Means different things to different observers
- “A right to be left alone”
- Common areas of privacy: data protection and privacy laws

What is personal information (PI)?

- In general, personal information includes any factual or subjective information, recorded or not, about an identifiable individual. This includes information in any form, such as:
 - name, age, student ID numbers, income
 - ethnic origin
 - disciplinary actions
 - medical records
 - biometrics (facial recognition, palm vein scan, fingerprint, retina scan)
 - online behaviour (“clicks”)

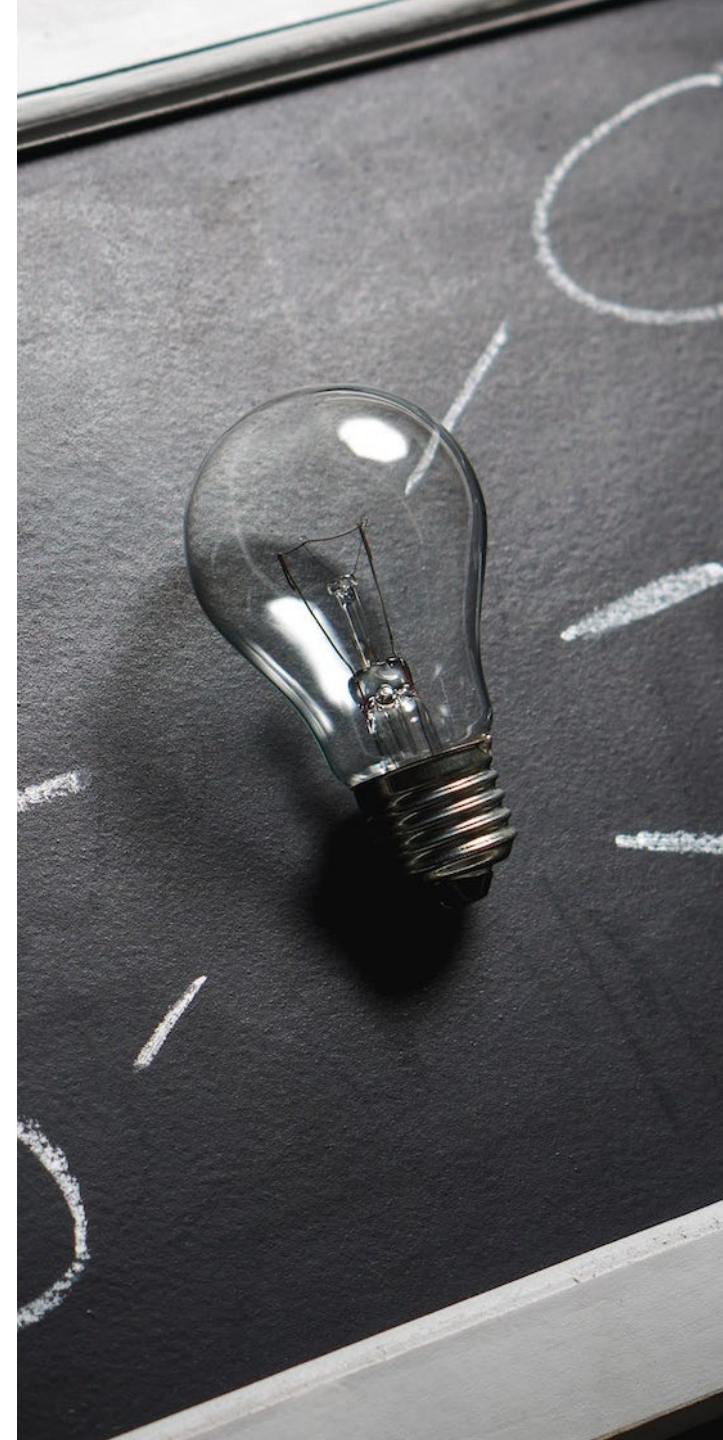
